

# SCAUG COLLABORATIVE SCHOLARSHIP

For Undergraduate and Graduate Students in the South Central United States

### What is the Scholarship?

The South Central Arc User Group (SCAUG) Collaborative Scholarship has been created to:

- encourage the goals of students and professionals who are working toward their undergraduate or graduate degree in a geospatial science.
- promote and support the increase of knowledge and proficiency of geospatial sciences in the south central region.
- recognize and encourage scholastic and professional accomplishments in the geospatial sciences.

#### How is the Scholarship Funded?

The SCAUG Collaborative Scholarship is funded by the SCAUG annual events and contributions from the private community.

#### What are the benefits of the scholarship?

- Scholarships of \$1500 will be awarded.
- Scholarships will be applied to student accounts to offset educational expenses.
- ullet Complimentary registration to 2013 Regional Conference in Addison, Texas on April 10 12, 2013.

#### How will the recipients be selected?

The scholarship recipients will be selected by the SCAUG officers. Selection will be based on merit and meeting eligibility requirements as outlined in the application. Scholarships will only be awarded if applicants deemed worthy by the SCAUG officers.

## When will the scholarships be awarded?

The application deadline is Friday, March 8, 2013. Recipients will be notified by March 22, 2013.

#### How will the scholarships be presented?

Scholarships will be presented to recipients at their respective educational institutions. If possible, a SCAUG representative will present the scholarship. An announcement of the scholarship winners will also be made at the Opening Breakfast of the Regional conference on Wednesday, April 10, 2013 in Addison, Texas.

## How do I apply?

Submit a complete application to SCAUG Vice President by March 8, 2013.

A complete application includes:

- Application form
- Sealed official transcript of current undergraduate or graduate educational courses
- Confirmation letter from Department Chair of enrollment in a geospatial related program at a recognized university, community college, or technical institution in the SCAUG region.
- Two Original letters of recommendation written and signed by multiple faculty members
- A one page statement (single-spaced) from the student outlining specific education and professional goals and outstanding accomplishments
- •All documents must be received in one packet in order to be considered.

#### Eligibility

- Applicant must be a registered student, in good standing, in a recognized university, community college, or technical institute in the SCAUG region.
- Applicant must be enrolled in a course of study in the field of geospatial sciences for the current and upcoming semester (not a 2013 spring or summer graduate).
- Applicant may not be a past recipient.

Receipt of your application will be acknowledged via e-mail only. You are encouraged to keep a copy of your application as the original will not be returned to you. Decisions regarding scholarships are made by the SCAUG officers and will be final. Recipients will be notified by March 22. Recipients will be acknowledged at their respective educational institutions as well as at the Opening Breakfast of the Regional Conference on April 10 in Addison, Texas.
