
Trails connecting Communities


- The purpose of the Mayes County Trails is to connect the Communities of Mayes County through multi modal trails.

Master Plan






ODOT 8 Year Plan

- The Trails Alliance was able to meet with ODOT to inform them about the Trails Master Plan and the future projects.
- With GIS data, they were able to provide the shapefiles of the Trails to ODOT.
- ODOT considers this data with the 8-year construction plans to help ensure easements and planning in coordination with the Trails Master Plan.
- The Trails will provide a safe alternative mode of travel throughout Mayes County.



Safe Streets and Roads for All Grant 2022

- The Mayes County Trails Alliance received a grant through U.S. Department of Transportation, the Safe Streets and Roads for All grant.
- This grant provides funding for the Mayes County Trails Alliance to create the Mayes County Comprehensive Safety Action Plan which allowed for Planning and Engineering to aid in the future construction of the trails and bike routes.



History along the Mayes County Trails

- The ODOT GIS department was able to create Storymap about the Historical points of interest throughout Mayes County that people traveling the trails can enjoying.
- This brings together the Trails Plan and local interest and tells a story that will allow the public to engage with the community around them.
